Is Advent Season a preparation for Jesus' Second Coming?

In the Creed we profess that:

"He ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty. From thence he will come to judge the living and the dead...."

The phrase *he will come* has been of interest to Christians from an early period in church history. Questions about the Second Coming of their Master were even in the mind of the apostles, because during his earthly ministry, especially in the last discourses, Jesus in parables urges his disciples to watch (Matt 24: 42, Mk 13:33, Luke 21:35-36, Matt 10:23, Matt 24:34, etc.) and he talked about the great events and the signs that will precede his return, and said; "Blessed are those servants who are found awake when the Lord comes" [Luke 12:37].

Every advent season, the most important issue in the minds of the apostles and the early Christians and after that in every believer's mind over the centuries was the problem of the time when this event would happen. After Christ's Ascension, as the church began to grow, some people started to set dates for the event they were waiting for according to the promise of their Savoir. Over the years, as the time of waiting became extended longer and longer, the Christians started to talk about two aspects of the *Parousia* (second coming of Christ): nearness and delay. Some early Christian in the time of Paul emphasized the idea that they will see Christ coming in their day, and Paul corrects them thus:

Concerning the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ and our being gathered to him, we ask you, brothers and sisters, not to become easily unsettled or alarmed by the teaching allegedly from us—whether by a prophecy or by word of mouth or by letter—asserting that the day of the Lord has already come. Don't let anyone deceive you in any way, for that day will not come until the rebellion occurs and the man of lawlessness is revealed, the man doomed to destruction. (2 Thess 2:1-3)

Paul's authority for clarifying this question was based on Jesus' own words. Jesus is very clear about the definite time of his coming declaring that nobody knows the day and the hour of it—"But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." (Matt 24: 36).

However, at his trial, when the high priest asked him to tell if he was the Messiah, the Son of God, Jesus not only gives an affirmative answer, but he adds some more information:

Jesus replied. "But I say to all of you: From now on you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One and coming on the clouds of heaven." (Matt 26:64).

Bible scholars have clarified that the central point of Jesus' message in Matt 26: 64, did not state the time when the event of *Parousia* will happen. He stated that the event is sure to happen but that nobody knows the hour of the Second Coming (Mark 13:32). Although it's been over 2000 years since Jesus lived on earth; no matter when it happens, the Parousia will be a great event seen not only by the faithful ones, but also by the most vehement accusers of Jesus. Our Christian faith essentially asks us to believe Jesus Christ and the Church's confession is grounded in Scripture and we are called to believe truly that it will 'happen' through the Holy Spirit and only God can make this expectation possible.
