Ask Father James:

My catholic friend went to a psychic recently and since then has not been in her right mind. What Does the Bible teach about occult activities like tarot cards, palm reading and psychic readings?

Adam and Eve, deceived by Satan were the first people to dabble into seeking other ways than God's ways. Satan said to them; "You will not certainly die," the serpent said to the woman. "For God knows that when you eat from it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil" (Genesis 3:4). Since then, this crave of wanting to know more than what God has revealed has led people to seek esoteric tools capable of revealing extra terrestrial secret knowledge and wisdom that Satan promised to reveal to Adam and Eve after they ate the apple.

Today, some Christians practice occultism and spiritualism - hoping that the worship of all kinds of Spirits, Angel spirits, Terrestrial spirits, Earthly spirits and ancestral spirits, etc., would reveal something and generate a healing wave. They approach psychic healers to use mediums to help them conjure these spirits hoping that the energy that radiate will open the doors of the spiritual world through teleportation. This craving for extra terrestrial, cosmic/cosmological/magical and metaphysical revelations became rolled up into one convenient package cheaply called occultism.

Others practice witchcraft and sorcery using psychic mediums. While the witch performs no rites, utters no spells, and possesses no medicine, the sorcerer deliberately employs magical rites, and the use of spells or hypnotism aids in the attempt to bring a result. There is also the practice of deck of 78 esoteric tarot cards which people have come to believe are invested with occult, mystical, divine, spiritual, and even psychological significance magical mystery. Like other mediums, people should know that, at its most sinister, the tarot is an indicator of, and perhaps gateway to, satanic worship.

Jesus condemns occultism and all kinds of sorcery and magical divinations. In Mark 3:22, when the Scribes accused Jesus of driving out demons by the power of Beelzebul, prince of demons, he responded by condemning the practice. In Luke 4:18 Jesus said; The Spirit of the Lord is upon him, because he was anointed to bring good news to the poor. He was sent to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour. Jesus came to proclaim release for people in bondage of occultism and all kinds of enslavement of the mind and to give recovery of sight to the blind who have strayed into occultism. Christians must have a liberative understanding of the Gospels. The Church exists to proclaim and bear witness to the kingdom of God. The hope is that those who have allowed themselves to be misled will heed Jesus' call; "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent and believe in the good news" (Mark 1:15).




